# Choosing The Right Carpet Cushion Is As Important As Choosing The Right Carpet.

Selecting the right carpet cushion is critical to protect an investment in new carpet. Quality carpet cushion absorbs shock from foot traffic, and helps prevent carpet fibers from matting and crushing. This helps keep the carpet looking fresh and new. There are other advantages to quality carpet cushion.

## Choosing the Right Carpet Cushion Couldn't Be Easier.

To make choosing the proper cushion simple, the Carpet Cushion Council is providing the following minimum recommendations for separate carpet cushion used in different traffic areas of the home. These recommendations have been adopted by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) under UM72a as its requirements for cushion used in FHA-financed housing.\*

Maximum thickness for any product is 0.5 inches.

Class 1: Light and Moderate Traffic such as living, dining, bedrooms, and recreational rooms.

Class 2 cushion may be used in Class 1 applications.

Class 2: Heavy Duty Traffic, such as lobbies and corridors in multi-family facilities, and all stair applications.

This chart illustrates products that meet **minimum** guidelines. Better grades of carpet cushion than the minimum suggested are always recommended when possible to provide more support and cushion for carpet. In areas where heavy use is expected, the Carpet Cushion Council suggests using firmer grades of cushion. These areas include stairways, halls, and areas where heavy furniture is used (such as living rooms and dining rooms). Softer cushion may be used in bedrooms and lounge areas where use is lighter and a plusher "feel" is desired.

\*HUD requirements have been in use for over 20 years, and have been proven to work. In addition, the Carpet Cushion Council in cooperation with other associations, has conducted extensive testing on different types of cushion to see how they perform in use. Ask your floorcovering dealer for cushion that meets or exceeds these requirements. The UM72a standards include other technical characteristics for each type of carpet cushion. ## Carpet Cushion . . .

### **Makes Carpet Feel More Comfortable.**

Tests show that quality carpet cushion can reduce the force on the floor covering caused by walking. This can improve personal comfort by reducing walking fatigue.

### **Makes Vacuuming More Efficient.**

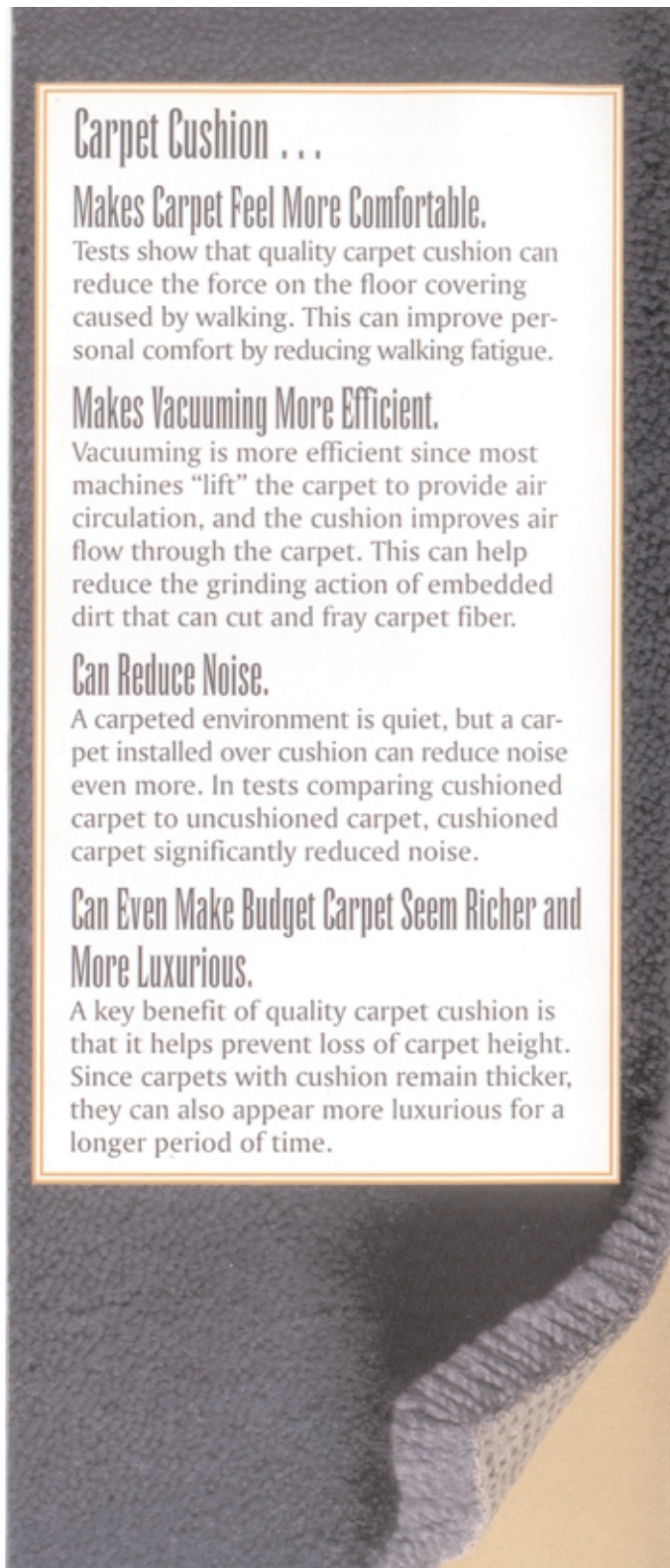
Vacuuming is more efficient since most machines "lift" the carpet to provide air circulation, and the cushion improves air flow through the carpet. This can help reduce the grinding action of embedded dirt that can cut and fray carpet fiber.


### **Can Reduce Noise.**

A carpeted environment is quiet, but a carpet installed over cushion can reduce noise even more. In tests comparing cushioned carpet to uncushioned carpet, cushioned carpet significantly reduced noise.

### **Can Even Make Budget Carpet Seem Richer and More Luxurious.**

A key benefit of quality carpet cushion is that it helps prevent loss of carpet height. Since carpets with cushion remain thicker, they can also appear more luxurious for a longer period of time.
